Montréal, a major international organization (IO) hub

- **3rd main IO hub in the Americas** along with Washington, D.C. and New York
- 68 international organizations, including six UN agencies
- 2,100 jobs
- \$450M in economic spin-offs per year
- World capital of civil aviation
- Focus on sustainable development (e.g. environment, education, human rights)



Operating cost index* for regional offices Selection of 12 cities worldwide, 2024





A major international congress and convention city

- Top host city in North America for international association events, according to the Union of International Associations
- The Palais des Congrès, a world-class convention centre located downtown: more than 550,000 sq. ft. of event space, including 110+ rooms and meeting places, 3 ballrooms and 4 terraces
- Dozens of additional venues to hold international events and meetings
- An affordable business destination with a 24% cost advantage on hotel rooms compared to New York City and Washington, D.C

Québec, a key player in the fight against climate change

- The lowest GHG emissions per capita in North America
- Aims to be carbon neutral by 2050 and reduce GHG emissions by 37.5% through the Québec government's 2030 Plan for a Green Economy*
- Part of the Québec-California carbon market (cap-and-trade system)
- Member of **several international groups** for reducing GHG, such as:



Québec, a circular economy pioneer in North America

• A solid expertise and collaborative networks, including:



- Réseau de recherche en économie circulaire du Québec (RRECQ), a network bringing together 110 researchers from 16 universities and 6 colleges
- A circularity index developed for the Québec economy in 2021 along with 7 societal goals
- Key high-potential sectors: agri-food, energy, construction, and metals







Montréal stands out for its commitment to the environment

- A commitment to reduce GHG emissions by at least 55% below 1990 levels by 2030 and achieve carbon neutrality by 2050
- Host of NATO Climate Change and Security Centre of Excellence and the second part of the UN Biodiversity Conference (COP15) in 2022
- Home of many international organizations fighting climate change
- Mayor of Montréal, ICLEI's Global Ambassador for Local Biodiversity*
- Montréal, most sustainable city in the world according to Compare the market, 2023

Montréal, a sustainable finance centre with an early adopter mindset

- In the top 10 in North America for green finance according to the Global Green Finance Index 2024
- A world-leading proportion of sustainable investment assets: 68% in Québec and 62% in Canada overall
- Many major Montréal-based institutions have adopted decarbonization targets toward achieving a carbon-neutral portfolio by 2050 such as CDPQ, Desjardins, Fonds de Solidarité FTQ, etc.
- The City of Montréal is part of the UN-convened International Network of Financial Centres for Sustainability (FC4S)
- The IFRS Foundation chose Montréal to establish its International Sustainability Standards Board (ISSB)


- A collaborative research ecosystem with 1,400+ members, as well as startups and major companies
