A unique opportunity to study in French and English

- **Presence of French and English educational institutions**
- Several institutions offer bilingual and trilingual programs
- Possibility of attending language courses, according to your needs and interests during your studies



Canada's biggest bilingual and trilingual metropolitan area

- 2.5 million people speak English, 9% more than in Vancouver
- 55% of the population is bilingual (French and English), compared to 8% in Toronto and 7% in Vancouver
- Almost 20% of the population is fluent in three or more languages, compared to 4% in Toronto and 3% in Vancouver



Vocational training, the opportunity to enter the labour market

- Vocational training is available in more than 50 educational centres in Greater Montréal
- It is aimed at learning a trade and allows access to one of the following official diplomas:
 - Diploma of Vocational Studies (DEP)
 - Attestation of Vocational Specialization (AVS)
 - Skills Training Certificate (STC)

Numerous opportunities through college education

Colleges of General and Vocational Education (cegeps) provide access to university studies or direct access to employment.

Pre-university training (2 years)

- Prepares for University
- Diploma of College Studies (DCS)

Technical Training (3 years)

- Prepares for the labour market and/or university studies
- Diploma of College Studies (DCS)

Technical training for adults (3 years or less)

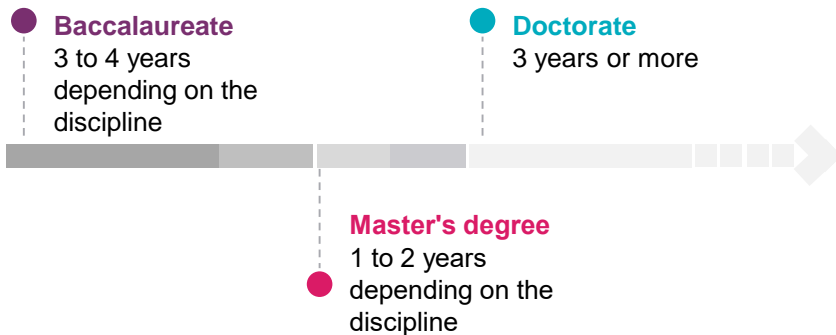

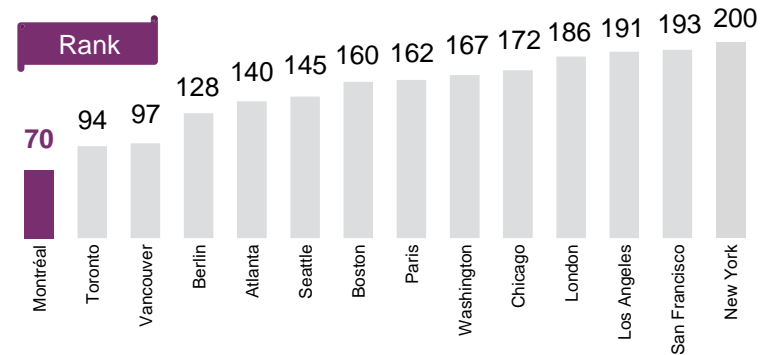




An advantageous cost of living

- low-cost childcare facilities

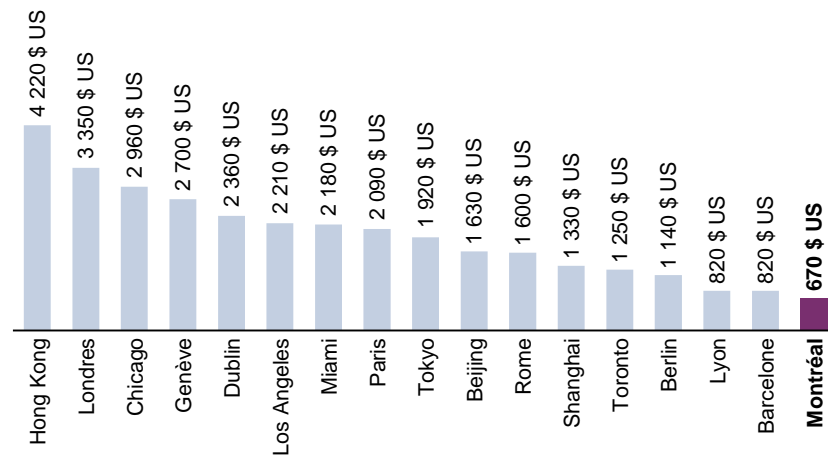

Numerous possibilities for financing studies

There are many financial grants for international students, such as:

- University excellence awards
- Excellence scholarships for vocational and technical training
- Excellence scholarships for college education
- Excellence scholarships from the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Nature and Technologies (FRQNT)
- Federal government scholarships (Canada)
- Commonwealth scholarships
- Scholarships from other countries
- Scholarships from international organizations

The possibility of working thanks to the study permit:

- Up to 20 hours per week off-campus during classes and full-time during leave and vacations
- Research and teaching assistant positions are also available

The opportunity to finance your studies through government agreements

- Montréal offers the **lowest tuition fees in North America**
- Numerous **funding opportunities for students thanks to agreements** between Québec and countries of origin:
 - School grants*
 - Tuition fee exemptions and reductions

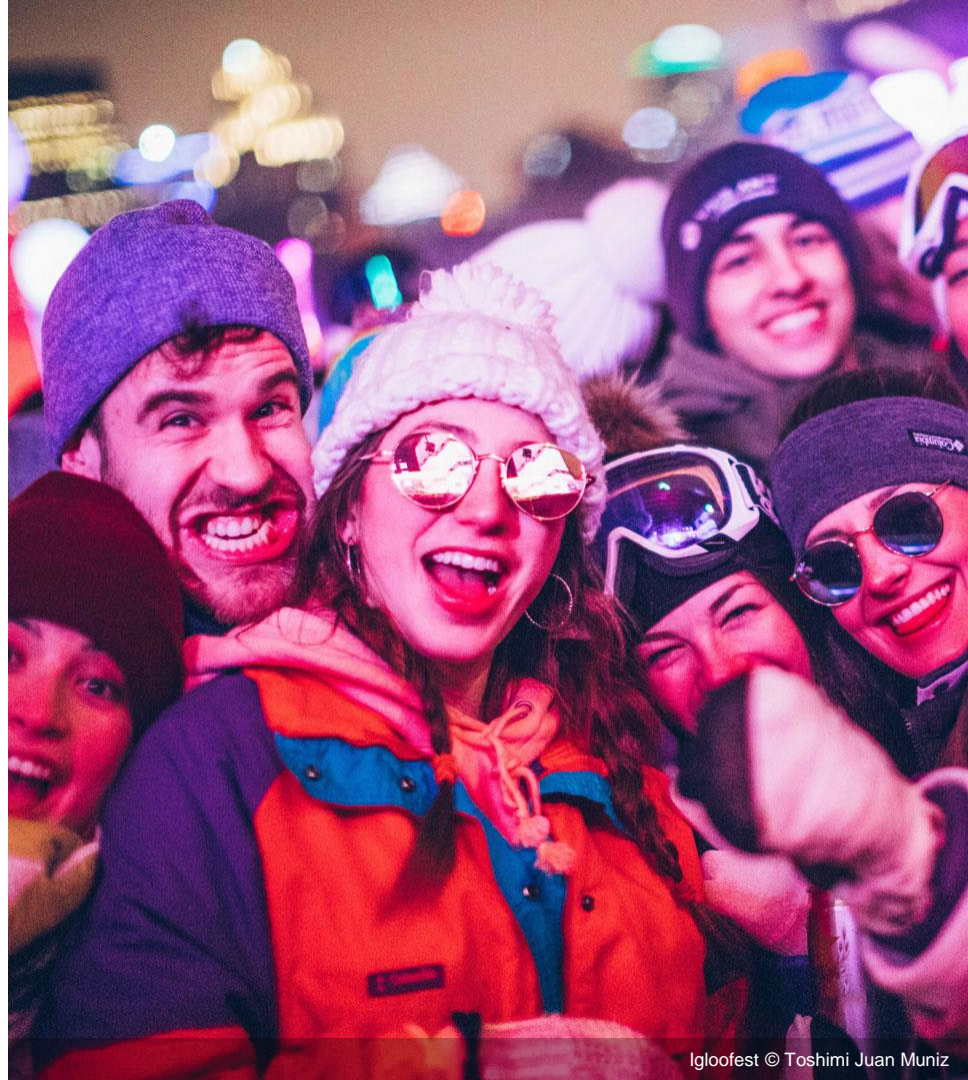

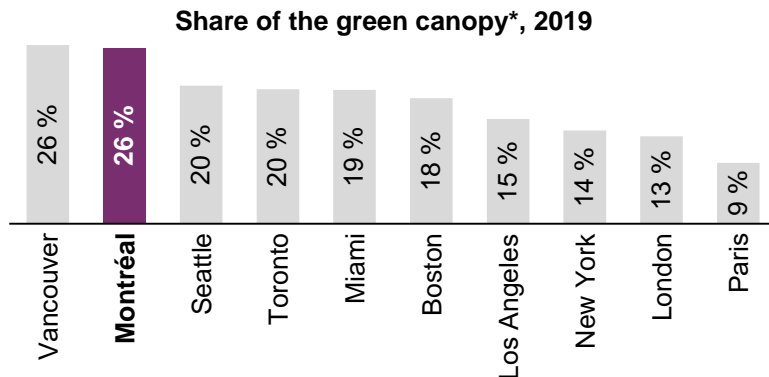

Montréal, one of the world's most tree-filled cities: 19 large urban parks covering nearly 2,000 hectares and 1,200 neighbourhood parks.



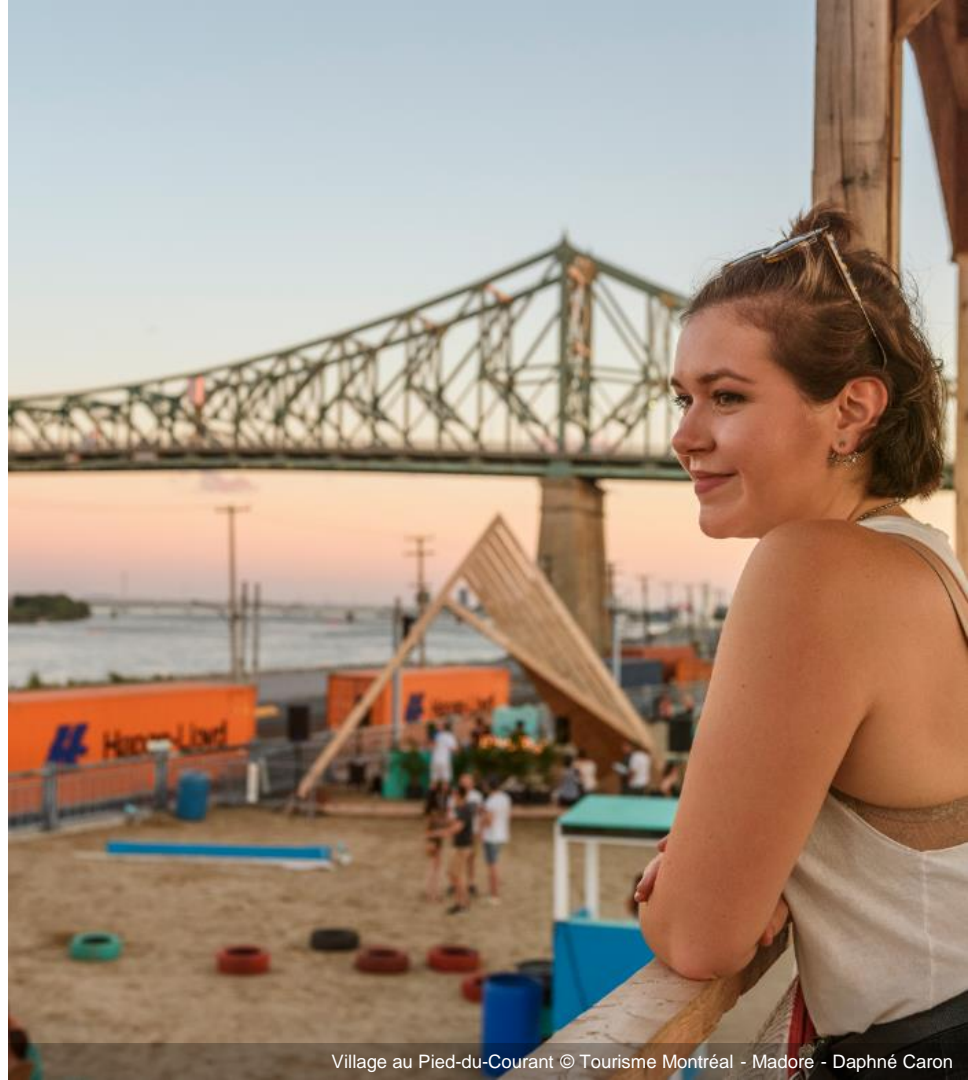
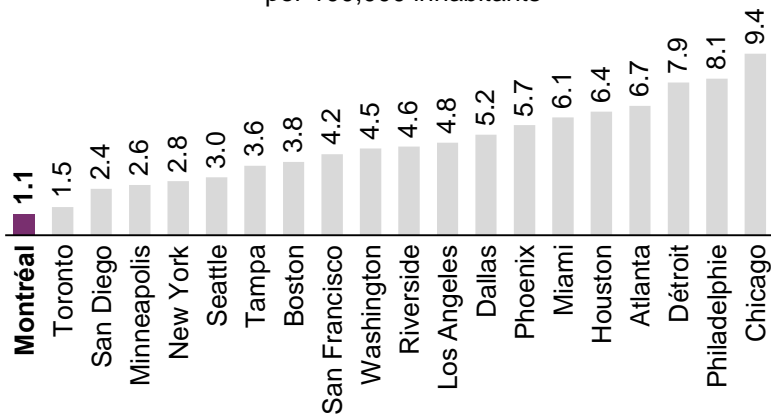

The steps to Montréal



What about after I graduate? Post-graduation work permit and permanent immigration



GRADUATION

Obtain a post-graduation work permit within 180 days after your institution has established your final grades, with a valid study permit at that time

**POST-GRADUATION
WORK PERMIT**
(from 8 to 36 months,
depending on the length
of the study program)



Step 1

Obtain a **Québec Selection Certificate (CSQ)** through the **Quebec Experience Program (QEP)** or the **Regular Skilled Worker Program (RSWP)**



Step 2

Obtain your permanent residence

PERMANENT IMMIGRATION PROCESS
(approximately 24 to 36 months, depending on the case)
