Montréal, the best student city in the Americas

- Montréal offers its students internationally recognized academic training:
 - Two universities in the top 150 best universities in the world: McGill (31st) and Université de Montréal (118th)
 - HEC Montréal in the top 100 best business schools in the world

Canada's post-secondary education capital

- Almost 320,000 post-secondary students, including 37,000 international university students
- 11 universities
- 60+ public colleges (cegeps*) and private colleges (pre-university and technical)
- 50+ vocational training centres
- \$1+ billion in funds yearly dedicated to university research

A unique opportunity to study in French and English

- Presence of French and English educational institutions
- Several institutions offer bilingual and trilingual programs
- Possibility of attending language courses, according to your needs and interests during your studies



Canada's biggest bilingual and trilingual metropolitan area

- 2.5 million people speak English, 9% more than in Vancouver
- 55% of the population is bilingual (French and English), compared to 8% in Toronto and 7% in Vancouver
- Almost 20% of the population is fluent in three or more languages, compared to 4% in Toronto and 3% in Vancouver

Vocational training, the opportunity to enter the labour market

- Vocational training is available in more than 50 educational centres in Greater Montréal
- It is aimed at learning a trade and allows access to one of the following official diplomas:
 - Diploma of Vocational Studies (DEP)
 - Attestation of Vocational Specialization (AVS)
 - Skills Training Certificate (STC)

Numerous opportunities through college education

Colleges of General and Vocational Education (cegeps) provide access to university studies or direct access to employment.

Pre-university training (2 years)

- Prepares for University
- Diploma of College Studies (DCS)

Technical Training (3 years)

- Prepares for the labour market and/or university studies
- Diploma of College Studies (DCS)

Technical training for adults (3 years or less)

- Prepares for the labour market
- Attestation of Collegial Studies (ACS)

There are 15 CEGEPs in Greater Montréal and more than 50 private colleges



Montréal universities offer training in all fields

University courses of study Baccalaureate 3 to 4 years depending on the discipline Master's degree 1 to 2 years depending on the discipline

 Short programs of various durations such as specialized graduate certificates or diplomas (DESS) are also available






A low cost of living

Greater Montréal is **cheaper than almost all other large cities** in North America, Western Europe, China and Japan:




The most affordable metropolitan area for rent

There are many financial grants for international students, such as:

- University excellence awards
- Excellence scholarships for vocational and technical training
- Excellence scholarships for college education
- Excellence scholarships from the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Nature and Technologies (FRQNT)
- Federal government scholarships (Canada)
- Commonwealth scholarships
- Scholarships from other countries
- Scholarships from international organizations

The possibility of working thanks to the study permit:

- Up to 20 hours per week off-campus during classes and full-time during leave and vacations
- Research and teaching assistant positions are also available

The opportunity to finance your studies through government agreements

- Montréal offers the lowest tuition fees in North America
- Numerous funding opportunities for students thanks to agreements between Québec and countries of origin:
 - School grants*
 - Tuition fee exemptions and reductions











Share of the green canopy*, 2019








The safest city in North America





The steps to Montréal



What about after I graduate? Post-graduation work permit and permanent immigration



Obtain a post-graduation work permit within 180 days after your institution has established your final grades, with a valid study

permit at that time



Step 1
Obtain a Québec Selection
Certificate (CSQ) through the
Quebec Experience Program
(QEP) or the Regular Skilled
Worker Program (RSWP)



Step 2
Obtain your
permanent residence

POST-GRADUATION
WORK PERMIT
(from 8 to 36 months,
depending on the length
of the study program)

PERMANENT IMMIGRATION PROCESS (approximately 24 to 36 months, depending on the case)
