










#### **Mercer Cost of Living Index**

Selection of major cities worldwide, 2024










## Operating a business costs less in Montréal than in other major metropolitan areas in Canada and the U.S.

## A range of incentives to support key projects and promote investment

#### Scientific Research and Experimental Development (SR&ED) incentive program

 15% credit from the Government of Canada, and
 14% non-repayable credit from the Government of Québec

#### Mitacs: Accelerate Program - Business component

 Fund collaborative research with a contribution of \$7,500 per unit (4- to 6-month unit) which is doubled, for a total research award of \$15,000 (1:1 ratio)

#### Refundable Multimedia tax credit (Video Game)

 The tax credit covers up to 37.5% of qualified labour expenditures if the multimedia title is available in French. If it is not available in French, the tax credit rate is up to 30%

#### **E-Business integrating AI**

 Refundable tax credit equal to 30% (20% refundable and 10% non-refundable) of eligible salaries




